SUBJECT:

Districting Public Hearing - Selecting Redistricting Map

SUMMARY

At its November 1st meeting the City Council received an extensive staff report and presentation on this issue with the full background, timeline and discussion of maps received in time for consideration at that meeting. Those materials remain accurate, and this report adds to that background information. Council is asked to receive a report on the process so far and the initial draft maps received, conduct the public hearing, receive public comments, select a preferred redistricting map, if necessary, determine the election sequencing, and adopt/introduce the appropriate redistricting ordinance. Two sets of ordinances are presented. One set for a 4 district scenario and one set for a 5 district scenario. For each scenario, there is one ordinance that is immediately effective and one that is introduced to be adopted at the next meeting.

For reasons detailed in the staff report for the November 1 Council meeting, NDC's recommendation remains that a five-district map is likely not required under the letter of the California and Federal Voting Rights Acts, but a five-district map would better comply with the spirit of those laws than a four-district map.

RECOMMENDATION

Following the completion of the presentation and public hearing, the City Council should:

- 1. Select a four district or five district map to be adopted by Ordinance.
- 2. Adopt an Ordinance that is immediately effective pursuant to Government Code section 36937; and
- 3. Introduce and waive reading in full of an Ordinance adopting by-district voting.

The titles of the proposed Ordinances are as follows:

Four Districts:

ISSUES AND ANALYSIS

At its November 1st meeting the Council received an extensive staff report and presentation on this issue with the full background, timeline and discussion of maps received in time for consideration at that meeting. Those materials remain accurate, and this report adds to that background information.

Timeline

The following is a timeline for this process:

October 25, 2021	Release of first draft maps online
November 1, 2021	First post-draft map public hearing. NDC provides initial draft of district maps, public feedback to date.
November 8, 2021	Second release of draft maps online
November 15, 2021	Second post-draft map public hearing. NDC provides final maps for Council consideration. City Council adopts and introduces ordinance establishing a "by-district" method of elections.
By December 15, 2021	City Council adopts ordinance establishing a "by-district" method of elections and setting election rotation in districts.

Analyzing the draft maps for the November 15th hearing

At the November 1st meeting, the Council requested that NDC provide full statistical analysis of the districts in the five-district "NDC Analysis" maps, and that NDC provide a similar proposed four-district map.

In addition to the three NDC five-district maps and the NDC four-district map requested by the Council, a paper-based map was received from Suzanne McDonough, five additional four-district maps were submitted via the DistrictR tool, and 21 additional five-district maps were submitted via the DistrictR tool. All of the DistrictR maps are available via the DistrictR gallery link on the City's redistricting website.

The over 30 public map submissions, along with the NDC-drafted maps, present a significant number of options to evaluate. The recommended first step in narrowing down those options is to eliminate those maps that are not population balanced and that divide the heavily Latino community of interest in the south end of the city, as discussed in the following paragraphs.

Population balanced maps

Of the five additional four-district maps, two are not population balanced. The Council-requested NDC Analysis 104 and the public map submissions d72847, d74581, and d77223 are population balanced. Statistical work-ups of these four maps are attached.

Of the twenty-one additional five-district maps, two are not population balanced (d72686 and d77420). And d71489 is not contiguous. So, the Council has the three NDC Analysis maps (101, 102 and 103) and eighteen public submissions of five-district maps, that are contiguous and meet the equal population requirements. Statistical work-ups of all twenty-one population-balanced maps are attached.

Divisions of the Latino community

Looking at the City's southern concentration of the Latino "protected class" population, four maps divide that population in a concerning manner. One of those four is the four-district map d72847, and the other three are five-district maps (d75012, d74612, and d73105). If those four are removed from consideration, there are three four-district maps and eighteen five-district maps available for Council consideration.

Fair Maps Act considerations

Among the maps that comply with the Federal equal population requirements and the Federal Voting Rights act, the California Fair Maps Act then requires the Council evaluate maps based on the following ranked criteria:

- 1. Contiguous (this eliminates d71489 as noted above)
- 2. Keep neighborhoods and communities of interest intact to the extent practicable
- 3. Follow easily recognizable boundaries to the extent practicable
- 4. Compact (avoid bypassing one group of people to get to another group of people) to the extent practicable

Among maps that address all of those statutory requirements, the Council can then consider other traditional redistricting principles including respecting the voters' wishes by avoiding pairing multiple Councilmembers in one district.

Council pairings

Among the remaining 3 public-submitted four-district maps, Councilmembers Davis and Lau are paired in all three. Map d72847 also pairs Councilmembers Carder and Crosby. Even when the location of Mayor Hepburn is left out of the analysis, the only four-district map with no Council pairings is the NDC Analysis Map 104.

Among the eighteen five-district maps left at this point in the analysis, five have one pairing of two councilmembers in a single district, and another six have two councilmembers paired in one district and two councilmembers in a second district. Six public five-district maps, along with the three "NDC Analysis" maps, have no Council pairings: d73905, d73928, d74592, d74612, d75926 and d76427.

Election Sequencing

If the Council selects a map that avoids pairing any current Councilmembers, by statute each district is assigned the election year of the resident Councilmember.

If the Council selects a map that pairs two Councilmembers who are on different election year sequences, the Council must determine whether the district in question is assigned to 2022 or 2024 (with the result that the vacant district elsewhere in the map is assigned to the other election year).

A Councilmember whose term ends in 2022 can run for re-election if residing in a 2022 district. Otherwise, that Councilmember will leave the Council at the end of the 2022 term and can run for election to the district where he/she resides when it comes up for election in 2024.


A Councilmember whose term ends in 2024 can run for re-election if residing in a 2024 district. If residing in a 2022 district, that Councilmember has the option to run for the district office midterm, in 2022. If successful, the Councilmember would resign the remaining two years of his/her current four-year term, creating a two-year, at-large, vacancy. If unsuccessful, the Councilmember could stay on the Council for the remaining two years of his/her current term (until 2024). That Councilmember would leave the council and could run for the Council again when that district comes up for election again in 2026.

PDF Maps Attached

Looking at three consideration of population balance, avoiding division of the southern Latino community of interest, reasonably addressing the Fair Maps Act requirements, and avoiding pairings of Councilmembers, there is one four-district map (NDC Analysis 104) and nine five-district maps (NDC Analysis 101, 102, and 103, and public maps d73905, d73928, d74592, d74612, d75926 and d76427).



AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE, COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES, STATE OF CALIFORNIA ESTABLISHING FIVE CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS FOR A BY-DISTRICT ELECTORAL SYSTEM AND CERTAIN RELATED MATTERS
WHEREAS , the City of La Verne currently elects the Mayor and Members of the City Council using an at-large system of elections; and
WHEREAS , pursuant to Government Code section 34886, the City Council has the authority to adopt an ordinance changing the system of elections in the City from an at-large election system to a by-district election system; and
WHEREAS, the change in the method for electing members of the City Council is made in furtherance of the purposes of the California Voting Rights Act; and
WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of Election Code section 10010, the City Council held public hearings on November 1, 2021 and November 15, 2021 regarding proposed draft district maps and received proposed draft maps from members of the public; and
WHEREAS, the City Council desires to implement by-district voting to be effective with the next General Municipal Election to be held on June 7, 2022; and
WHEREAS, on November 15, 2021, the City Council selected one of the proposed district maps to establish the City Council electoral districts in the City, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and
WHEREAS, the City Council has taken all legal prerequisites to the enactment of this Ordinance; and
WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to adopt this Ordinance to establish by district elections in five single-member districts in the City, and to adopt the map depicting the boundaries and identifying number of the five City Council districts in the City.
NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VERNE DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
<u>Section 1.</u> The above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.
Section 2. A new Chapter 2.10 - City Council Elections by District is hereby added to the La Verne Municipal Code to read as follows:

CHAPTER 2.10 - CITY COUNCIL ELECTIONS BY DISTRICT

2.10.010 Declaration of Purpose

The City Council hereby declares the purpose of this Chapter is to further the purposes of the California Voting Rights Act (Elections Code 14025 et seq.), as amended.

2.10.020 By-District Elections for City Council

- A. Pursuant to Government Code section 34886, members of the City Council shall be elected by-district in five single-member districts. Members of the City Council shall be elected by-district meaning one member of the City Council shall be elected from each district by the voters of that district alone. Each member of the City Council shall serve a four-year term until his or her successor is qualified.
- B. Pursuant to Government Code section 34882, the City Council member elected to represent a district must reside in that district and be a registered voter in that district, and any candidate for City Council must reside in, and be a registered voter in, the district in which he or she seeks election at the time nomination papers are issued, Pursuant to Elections Code section 10227.

2.10.030 City Council Districts Established

- A. The boundaries and identifying number of each of the five City Council districts shall be as described on the City Council District Map attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and incorporated herein by this reference.
- B. The City Council districts described in subsection A, above, shall continue in effect until they are amended or repealed in accordance with law. The boundaries of the City Council districts shall be reapportioned from time to time as required by the Elections Code or any other applicable law.

2.10.040 Implementation of By-District Elections

- A. The by-district system of elections shall be implemented beginning at the General Municipal Election to be held June 7, 2022, as follows:
 - 1. Members of the City Council shall be elected in districts 1, 3 and 4 beginning at the General Municipal Election on June 7, 2022, and every four years thereafter; and
 - 2. Members of the City Council shall be elected in districts 2 and 5 beginning at the General Municipal Election in March 5, 2024, and every four years thereafter.
- B. No term of any member of the City Council that commenced prior to the effective date of this Chapter shall be affected by the adoption of this Chapter.
- <u>Section 3.</u> La Verne Municipal Code Section 2.08.030 Organization meeting shall be revised to read as follows:

2.08.030 Organizational meeting

The City Council shall meet at the regularly scheduled meeting following the meeting at which the declaration of election results was made and choose one of its members as Mayor and one of its members as Mayor Pro Tem. In non-election years, the City Council shall choose a Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem at the first anniversary of the previous selections.

<u>Section 4.</u> Severability. The City Council declares that should any provision, section, paragraph, sentence or word of this Ordinance be rendered or declared invalid by any final court of competent jurisdiction or by reason of any preemptive legislation, the remaining provisions, sections, paragraphs, sentences or words of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>Section 5.</u> Effective Date. The Mayor shall sign and the Assistant City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this Ordinance and shall cause it to be posted pursuant to the provisions of law in that regard. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately, pursuant to Government Code section 36937, as it is an Ordinance relating to an election.

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



SUMMARY

On July 6, 2021, the City Council approved Resolution No. 21 - 47, initiating procedures for establishing and implementing By-District Voting for City Council Elections. In accordance with State law, a series of public hearings were held to consider the proposed district boundary maps and receive public input. This is the next public hearing in the series for considering the draft district boundary maps. Throughout this process, public's input was received pertaining to district boundaries.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Receive a report on the process. so far and the initial draft maps received, conduct the public hearing, receive public comments, and provide direction to demographic consultant regarding the proposed district boundary maps.

BACKGROUND

In December 2020 and July 2021, the La Verne City Council conducted two study sessions exploring the purpose and process of districting.

With several resident requests and numerous nearby jurisdictions facing legal challenges on the basis of their election systems over the years, the La Verne City Council consulted with National Demographics Corporation regarding the City's election system options in December 2020.

While the City has not yet received any legal challenges to its election system, the Council determined it prudent to initiate the districting process to prevent any costly potential legal challenges and better understand its by-district election system options.

At its July 2021 meeting, the Council unanimously adopted Resolution No. 21-47 which, among other things, stated:

 Is in the best interest of the City to move from its current at-large electoral system to a by-district election for all five members of the City Council pursuant to California

- Is in the best interest of the City to move from its current at-large electoral system to a
 by-district election for all five members of the City Council pursuant to California
 Government Code section 34886 and in furtherance of the purposes of California Voting
 Rights Act; and
- Begin by working with an experienced demographer to assist the City in establishing maps for a by-district electoral system.

During the same July meeting, the City Council also directed City staff to engage National Demographics Corporation as its demographer to guide the City through the districting process.

Mapping criteria were endorsed by the Council at the July 2021 meeting, which included the following:

- 1. The boundaries of the electoral districts shall be established so that the electoral districts are equal in population as defined by law.
- 2. The boundaries of the electoral districts shall not be gerrymandered in violation of the principles established by the United States Supreme Court in *Shaw v. Reno*, 509 U.S. 630 (1993), and its progeny.
- 3. The boundaries of the electoral districts shall be established so that the electoral districts do not result in a denial or abridgement of the right of any citizen to vote on account of race or color as provided in Section 2 of the Federal Voting Rights Act.
- 4. The boundaries of the electoral districts shall observe communities of interest as identified in public comment or identified by the city council, including, but not limited to rural or urban populations; social interests; agricultural, industrial or service industry interests; residential and commercial areas, the location of city facilities and historical sites, and the like, insofar as practicable.
- 5. The boundaries of the electoral districts shall be compact, insofar as practicable.
- 6. The boundaries of the electoral districts shall be created to contain cohesive, contiguous territory, insofar as practicable.
- 7. The boundaries of the electoral districts may observe topography and geography, such as the existence of mountains, flat land, forest lands, man-made geographical features such as highways, major roadways and canals, etc., as natural divisions between districts, insofar as practicable.
- 8. Unless otherwise required by law, the electoral districts shall be created using whole census blocks, insofar as practicable.
- 9. The boundaries of the electoral districts may avoid the "pairing" of incumbents in the same electoral district, insofar as this does not conflict with the constitution and laws of the State of California and the United States.
- 10. The boundaries of the electoral districts shall comply with such other factors which become known during the districting process and are formally adopted by the City Council.

ISSUES/ANALYSIS

In accordance with State law, a series of public hearings were scheduled to consider the proposed district boundary maps and receive public input. This is the first of the public hearings to consider draft district boundary maps. The maps and associated documents were made available on the City's website www.maplaverne.org as of October 25, 2021. Throughout this process the public's input is welcomed and comments pertaining to district boundaries may be submitted online at MapLaVerne.org.

Timeline

The following is a timeline for this process:

October 25, 2021	Release of first draft maps online
November 1, 2021	First post-draft map public hearing. NDC provides initial draft of district maps, public feedback to date.

By December 15, 2021	City Council adopts ordinance establishing a "by-district" method of elections and setting election rotation in districts; and adopts a resolution.

Number of Districts

The Council-adopted resolution specified moving to a five-district election system with a rotating Mayor, but the Council also stated the decision between that and a four-district system with a citywide-elected Mayor was a decision they might reconsider after hearing from the public.

Data delays

By Federal statute, the 2020 federal census data was required to be released before April 1, 2021. Due to COVID and other delays, the federal government did not release that data until four and a half months later: August 12, 2021. California also adopted a law requiring cities and counties (and, later, school districts) to use state-adjusted data wherein the state would move the people counted in state prison facilities at their last known home address. The state promised the release of that data within "four to six weeks" of the federal census data release. In the end, the state took over five weeks, releasing the state-adjusted data September 21st. When the City's demographer, NDC, examined the state data, NDC discovered errors in the data that the state acknowledged and corrected, further delaying the release of the stateadjusted official redistricting data to September 27th, 2021.

Of course, the state deadline for the city to complete the districting process is unchanged, on December 15th, 2021. The net result is that instead of having data available the day the Council adopted the resolution in July and five months to complete the districting process, state law and the data delays allow the city only eleven weeks to complete the process.

Public Mapping Tools

Due to the delays with the data, the City engaged NDC to launch the DistrictR online mapping tool for residents to draw maps using estimated total population data. As the state data delays became longer, the even-more-compressed timeframe (and the untimely resignation of their lead programmer) led to major delays in getting the DistrictR tool updated with the official redistricting data. Even after the City extended the deadline for the public to submit draft maps (allowing submissions right up to the statutory deadline for posting submissions online), the District team was unable to update the tool with the official redistricting data prior to the deadline.

The citywide differences between the estimated total population data and the state-adjusted official redistricting data were relatively small:

The differences in individual census blocks could be significantly larger percentages, however, so a plan that appeared within the 10% overall population deviation in the DistrictR tool could end up over 10% when analyzed using the state-adjusted data (the attached datasheets for each plan use the official state-adjusted redistricting data). If the Council prefers a map that ended up with a population deviation reasonably close to the 10% range, the Council may select that map and direct NDC to make adjustments to bring the plan into compliance with the equal population requirements using the state-adjusted official redistricting data.

Among the five initial draft maps submitted, only one is population balanced using the official redistricting data (Public 103). But two others were population balanced as drawn in DistrictR using the estimated population data (Public 102 and the four-district Public 105). The other two submissions were close but just outside the 10% maximum in the DistrictR tool (Public 101 at 13.12% and the four-district Public 104 at 14.41%), and these two became even farther outside the 10% range when imported into the state-adjusted official data (28.67% and 18.89%, respectively).

Analyzing the initial draft submissions

At this hearing, the public and Council are encouraged to consider the submitted draft maps and provide direction on what changes the Council would like to see made either to one or more of these maps or in all-new maps.

NDC provided the following analysis of the five draft maps:

Population balance:

The population balance using the estimated and official redistricting data are as follows:

Voting Rights Act compliance and avoiding racial gerrymandering

South of Bonita, La Verne has a region where Latinos are a particularly concentrated population of citizens of voting age (CVAP). While this concentrated population is not large enough to be a majority of a Council district, this population can be up to 40% of the total eligible voters in a district (as measured by CVAP).

Public 101: Unites the area south of Bonita in District 4.

Public 102: Unites the area south of Bonita in District 4.

Public 103: Has the most-concentrated areas united in District 5, though there is some division.

Public 104: Divides southern La Verne roughly along B St.

Public 105: Divides southern La Verne roughly along A St.

Contiquity:

NDC was able to correct any contiguity issues in the submitted maps.

Neighborhoods and Communities

Public 101 and Public 103 clearly work hard to minimize the division of neighborhoods and communities. Public 104 is not quite as good, but still seems focused on avoiding such splits. Public 105 and, especially, Public 102 have significantly more 'zigs and zags' potentially splitting neighborhoods and/or communities of interest.

Following Major Roads and other easily identifiable borders

Public 101 follows major roads for every border, which looks very appealing but directly leads to its population imbalance. Public 103 is nearly perfect on this goal, with only the D3/D4 border and a bit of the D1/D2 border not following large roads. Public 104 is not too far behind 103 in success at following major roads. Public 102 and Public 105 almost never follow major roads as their borders.

Compactness

Compactness is last in the state's proscribed redistricting criteria. Public 101 is extremely compact (which, like following major roads, contributes to its lack of population balance). For the most part, Public 102 is reasonably compact, with the exception of the eastern "arm" of D5. Public 103 is highly compact (and population balanced). Public 104 and Public 105 are both quite compact as well.

Councilmember "pairings"

If two or more Councilmembers end up in one district, all of them complete their current terms to their currently scheduled end of term. But, regardless of whether how many of them the voters believe deserve re-election, only one can be re-elected. Thus, the district lines can take away the power of voters to re-elect their preferred Councilmembers, if a map "pairs" two or more Councilmembers.

Public 101 has two "pairs": Hepburn & Carder in one district and Davis & Lau in another.

Public 102 pairs Hepburn & Carder.

Public 103 pairs Hepburn & Carder.

Public 104 pairs the entire council into two districts, dictating that for a majority of the Council their current term will be their last: Hepburn, Carder & Crosby are paired in one district, while Davis & Lau are paired in another.

Four-District maps' impact on Latino voting strength

As noted above, the region south of Bonita has a particular concentration of Latino eligible voters. But even with the smaller districts of a five-district map, this population is not large enough to be a majority of a district. Because there is one geographic concentration of Latinos who fit inside a single district in a five-district map, selecting a four-district map is allowed but would reduce the Latino voting strength of the southern district, even if that district is drawn to avoid splitting the region. This is because in the larger four-district area, there are still the same number of Latinos. A four-district map simply puts more non-Latinos in with that set Latino population to reach population balance, where the smaller five-district map would necessitate fewer non-Latino residents would need to be added in to reach population balance.

NDC Options

Because of the reduced voting strength of Latinos in the southern region of the city in a four-district map (even if Public 104 or Public 105 are modified to avoid physically dividing the neighborhood), NDC recommends not adopting a four-district map.

Public 102

The eastern "arm" of D5 is non-compact and does not appear driven by any of the higher-ranked criteria (except population balancing). Shifting the north-south portion of D5 from the west side of the city to the east side would maintain this district's compliance with the other criteria; could eliminate that non-compact element; and would eliminate the Council pairing currently in D1 of this map. (There is a very long and skinny census block that runs along the eastern edge of the city from Baseline Rd all the way north to Golden Hills Rd that forces an odd-looking 'stair step' edge to the D1/D5 border.

In the south, the regional unity of the area south of Bonita and the compactness of D2/D3/D4 can be significantly improved as well, with the net result of bringing the Latino share of eligible voters up to 41% - higher than in any of the Public maps submitted so far. After these changes, no Councilmembers would be paired.

All of these changes except 'flipping" D5 from the west to the east are designed to preserve the goals and decisions made by the author of Public 102. And the changes accomplish this within an overall plan deviation of just below 7.5%.

A map showing these options for revision to Public 102 is included in the NDC presentation as "NDC Analysis 102."

Public 103

Similar changes (flipping northern D3 from the east side of the city to the western side; moving the University of La Verne into D5, and cleaning up the compactness of the districts) similarly may improve Public 103, though with a 7.75% overall plan population deviation. And the changes maintain the 41% Latino share of CVAP in southern D5.

Public 101

NDC's analysis found that addressing the population balance issues in Public 101 require significant changes – and while making those population balancing changes it is also possible to avoid pairing any Councilmembers. The result still follows few major roads, but it is reasonably compact, generally follows neighborhood and community of interest borders, is population balanced (overall plan deviation of just 5.45%) and brings Latinos up to 41.5% of CVAP in southern D4.

Final note about NDC analysis maps


The recommendation is that the Council consider the initial five draft maps before it and provide direction on what changes or new maps it would like NDC to bring back for the next hearing. Of the five Public maps, only Public 103 is sufficiently balanced to select as a "focus" map without requesting that NDC revise it to balance populations and achieve any other concerns the Council would like addressed in each selected or requested "focus" map.

If the Council wishes, NDC can work up any of the "Analysis" sketches up into a formal map for the Council's consideration at the next hearing on this topic.

Election Sequencing

State law requires that a proposed election sequence be provided for each initial draft map. By law, three districts in a five-district map or two districts in a four-district map must be up for election in 2022.


The move to by-district elections has no impact on current Council terms, even for those members elected to four-year terms in 2020. If a member whose term ends in 2022 ends up in a district that holds an election in 2024, the member will leave the Council at the end of the current term. If a member whose term ends in 2024 ends up in a district that holds an election in 2022, that Councilmember has the option of running, mid-term, for that by-district seat. If the 2024 Councilmember wins that election, the Councilmember would resign the remaining two years of the 2024 term (leaving a vacancy) and be sworn into the district's four-year seat/term. If that Councilmember loses that 2022 election, the Councilmember continues on the Council for the remaining two years of the current 2024 election. This can lead to difficult Council dynamics, as the 2024 Councilmember serves two years on the council alongside the Councilmember who just defeated him or her in the election.






